On July 21, 2025, the commission team conducted an unannounced visit to Twin Towers, Tower #1, specifically modules 142E and 162E. This visit was prompted by a death that occurred earlier that day in module 142E, cell #9. Upon arrival, all elevators were operational except elevator #1. The inspection team first checked in with Watch Commander Lt. Castro, who was watching Fox News in the command post. He noted that he believed the individual who died had passed due to "natural causes," and that a prior death in the same module on July 12, 2025, had been ruled a suicide. He stated there were no active concerns to report.

### Module 142E (K10 / MOH Unit)

Upon entering Module 142E, inspectors observed one deputy watching the film Iron Man on a county-issued computer. The deputy paused the movie upon our approach. When this was later reported to the Watch Commander, he minimized the concern, stating, "We're in law enforcement and we need to destress," and indicated he did not want the follow-up report emailed or otherwise shared.

### Death Incident (Cell #9):

The cell was observed to be cleaned, and a photograph of the deceased individual was placed on a nearby table. Incarcerated individuals housed nearby reported that the deceased had repeatedly requested medical attention in the days prior, citing dizziness, sleep deprivation, and difficulty breathing. He had a known history of head trauma and was believed to be diabetic.

#### According to witness reports:

- -A detective interviewed the deceased at his cell door the day before the incident.
- -He continued to report feeling unwell through the day.
- -During dinner at approximately 6:00 PM, it took the deceased individual 10 minutes to retrieve his meal after repeated prompting by deputies.
- -At pill call (7:00 PM), he did not respond.
- -By 3:00 AM, when he was scheduled for court transport, he was nonresponsive. Despite this, nursing staff insisted he be given medication before deputies conducted a cell extraction. He was found unresponsive at that time.

Multiple individuals in neighboring cells described what they believed to be missed opportunities by staff to intervene or offer care. They indicated that safety checks were being conducted but claimed deputies merely scanned barcodes without engaging with incarcerated persons or visually confirming their wellbeing.

General Conditions in Module 142E

### Showers

-Water in the showers was not hot. Showers were reportedly canceled due to the death in the module. One individual (Booking #7040570) reported not having had a shower since July 15.

### Air Quality:

-A resident in Cell #4 requested a work order due to poor ventilation making it hard to breathe.

### Cleanliness

Cells had graffiti, low water pressure in sinks, and generally poor hygiene conditions.

### Blankets and Temperature:

Several individuals complained about cold temperatures and receiving only one blanket. Requests for additional blankets have gone unaddressed.

### TV and Noise:

 $\hbox{-}TV \ remains on the same channel for extended periods and at high volume, contributing to increased agitation.$ 

# Medical Access:

-Sick call requests were said to take weeks for a response, despite nurses entering the module daily for medication distribution at 7:00 PM.

### Deputy Conduct:

-Individuals reported that deputies—including trustees—were apathetic and desensitized, frequently ignoring requests and failing to visually verify cell conditions. Comments included:

"Any movement is a challenge for them...they just pass by us and keep walking."

"They don't check what is happening inside cells."

"They just scan the code for safety checks...say they'll look into things but never follow up."

One individual identified Deputy Damien as notably helpful and attentive.

### Individual Complaints in 142E

Has not received hormone treatment. Visibly presenting female secondary sex characteristics. Also has not been to court since arrest on July 15. Records showed multiple court misses, possibly linked to module lockdowns.

Previously housed at PDC-North. Involved in an incident there but received no disciplinary write-up. Was reclassified as K10 and transferred to 142. Wishes to appeal the K10 designation. Also reported only having one blanket.

Has a visible infection on his lower back and has not been seen by medical despite submitting sick call/medical requests slips.

### Module 162E - Additional Concerns

Would like assistance with Social Security and housing planning prior to release. Would like to make request for referral to reentry services.

#### J. Kikuchi

Reported that there was no fresh air circulation in his cell (believed to be Cell #11).

#### Additional Concerns

The complaint box was full, and it was unclear whether it is being checked or emptied regularly by supervisory staff.

#### Conclusion and Recommendations

The inspection raised significant concerns regarding access to medical care, staff responsiveness, cleanliness, and environmental conditions. The reports from incarcerated individuals surrounding the death in Cell #9 suggest multiple systemic failures in health and safety protocols. Follow-up and further review of medical response timelines, staff engagement in modules, access to hygiene, and the process for resolving grievances are recommended.

Immediate attention to the following is advised:

- -Evaluation of deputy conduct and accountability procedures.
- -Review of medical request response timelines.
- -Ensure adequate blankets and proper temperature regulation.
- -Address malfunctioning showers and improve access to hygiene.
- -Confirm that complaint systems (e.g., boxes) are being maintained and processed.
- -Reevaluate housing classifications and missed court dates for affected individuals.
- -Provide clear pathways for incarcerated individuals to access reentry support services prior to release.

The use of any Department IT resource is restricted to those activities related to Department business. Use of computers, electronic communications equipment, and body-worn camera equipment by employees is authorized in support of the law enforcement mission of the Department and the administrative functions that support that mission. Authorized persons shall adhere to this policy as well as the guidelines set forth in the County Electronic Data Communications and Internet Policies.

Authorized persons are expected to abide by the standards of conduct delineated in other volumes, chapters, and sections of the Department's Manual of Policy and Procedures as they may be applied to the use of electronic communications and use and release of information. Department IT resources are subject to search and users are obligated to surrender any such resources and/or devices at any time to authorized Department personnel.

# 3-17/000.00 Viewing of Movies by Inmates and Department Personnel

It is the goal of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department to provide a comfortable work environment to its Department members. As such, the viewing of any inappropriate or offensive movie in the workplace is prohibited.

For the purpose of this policy, "movie" refers to any format a movie can be contained (e.g., videocassette, DVD, film, mpeg, those received from an Internet, cable, or satellite signal, or any other form)

Department members are prohibited from bringing in, viewing, or playing any of the following movies within a County facility, bus, or vehicle:

- Any movie rated "R," "X," or "NC-17"
- Any movie that contains material of a sexually explicit nature
- Any movie that has not been rated by or approved for production by the Motion Picture Association of America (MPAA)
- Any unrated version of a movie that was formally rated by the MPAA
- Any unlicensed, "bootlegged," or otherwise illegally recorded copy of a movie
- Any television recordings, home-made videos, or movies not licensed for public viewing

No movie with any of the above content shall be played or aired for viewing by personnel or inmates within the Sheriff's Department custody at any time.

Additionally, Department members are prohibited from brining any communication or recording device used for viewing movies, such as DVD players, digital cameras, or any items described in Custody Division Manual (CDM) section 3-01/090.00, "Security of Personal Property," into a custody facility without prior approval from the watch commander. Department members are prohibited from bringing a wireless communication device as described in CDM section 3-01/090.05, "Wireless Communication Devices," into a custody facility without the approval of the respective Division chief.

Exceptions to this policy include any of the above material being viewed for the specific purpose of "training" or in direct correlation to an investigation. Any training material that includes any of the above content shall be approved by the watch commander prior to its viewing.

Upon arrival, check-in was conducted with Watch Commander Lt. Joseph Grigorian. During the check-in, Lt. Grigorian raised concern regarding an incident earlier in the afternoon where a deputy was allegedly attacked by an incarcerated person.

MODULE 1750 - B&G ROW

G Row Observations & Reports

**Environmental Conditions:** 

- -The shower stall was observed to be dirty with water running continuously, contributing to possible mold or mildew growth and water waste.
- -Lighting in the row was dim, reducing visibility and potentially affecting mood and safety.
- -Cell doors and observation windows were grime-covered, indicating infrequent or ineffective cleaning.
- -Overdose prevention materials (Narcan & fentanyl education poster) were present, which is a positive harm reduction measure.
- -(Cell #4): Sink does not drain properly, resulting in water backup and unsanitary conditions. Reports consistent access to showers, meals, and court transportation. Has been detained in county jail for approximately 2 years pending trial/sentencing—raising concerns about pretrial detention conditions and mental health stress.

B Row Observations & Reports

Environmental & Sanitary Conditions:

- -Deep layers of filth were observed on many observation windows, especially cells #7, #8, and #11.
- -TV access is limited to 2 channels with no sound or closed captions, impairing access for individuals with hearing challenges and depriving general entertainment or educational value.
- -Bread with visible mold was served during a recent lunch—verified by commissioners—posing a serious food safety concern.
- -In #9 and #11, window obstructions prevent visibility out of the cell, contributing to sensory deprivation.
- -Cells have graffiti, inconsistent temperature control, and little evidence of routine cleaning.
- -Toilet issues reported in multiple cells:
- #17: Leaking toilet
- #23: Partial flush and no water stream
- #16: Abandoned cell with brown stains down the wall
- -Brown-stained light fixture near #19 following a past flood suggests possible exposure to hazardous waste.

Access to Services:

- -Limited yard/dayroom time; several incarcerated reported no outdoor time for weeks to months, including cell#2 and others.
- -Reports of grievances being ignored or thrown out; some I/Is declined to elaborate due to fear of retaliation (cell #4).
- -Cell #2: Reports only 1 roll of toilet paper per week, inconsistent hygiene resources.

Medical, Mental Health, & Dietary Concerns - 1750B

**Unmet Special Dietary Needs:** 

- -Cell#15: receiving peanut butter and bologna despite allergies.
- -Cell #17: peanut butter allergy + unmet medical needs.
- -Cell#4: cleared for a special diet but not receiving it.
- -Serious food safety issues and legal exposure due to failure to honor dietary restrictions.

Critical Medical Needs:

-Cell#19 reportedly vomiting blood for over a month with no medical treatment.

-Cell#24: Spanish-speaking individual, Untreated mental health symptoms, Ineffective current medication, has barriers to psychiatric care, has had multiple denied or ignored attempts to enroll in MAT/Suboxone treatment for opioid use disorder.

#### 2600 Module

Upon entering 2600, the module had a strong odor of campfire smoke. Deputy Dich approached commissioners and challenged their presence in the module, requesting an escort despite earlier communications indicating it was not required. He was visibly frustrated and dismissive. During this time, an incarcerated individual was seen walking outside his cell. Deputy Dich instructed the person to return to his cell, stating, "I'm tired of you leaving your cell... you keep doing this... now you are making me mad." The individual returned after the deputy opened the door. It is unclear how long he had been out, but there is a possibility the door had been tampered with or left unsecured.

#### Air & Water Issues:

- -Persistent massive smoke odor in unit.
- -Cell #2: No hot water.
- -Cell #11: Only hot water; no access to cold water.

### Security & Access:

- -Two cell doors appear to be malfunctioning or left unlocked.
- -Deputy Dich attempted to block inspector access without escort.

### Plumbing & TV:

- -Cell #3: Ongoing issues with phone, toilet, and sink. Incarcerated person reported a broken toilet for over 3 weeks. Toilet was covered with a towel. Noted that "nicer" deputies allow him to use the dayroom toilet when available. Light was covered with cloth; graffiti was observed on the walls.
- -Cell #4:Four individuals housed in cell with dim lighting covered by cloth. Reported that the sink only produces hot water. Food is served cold due to delays in distribution. Phone is inoperable; no visits in over a month.

Cell#5 Occupant in cell for the past 7 days. Phone is non-functional. Stated deputies ignore safety checks and refuse to respond when approached. Reported no shower in over a week due to court transportation. Complained of excessive smoke odors throughout jail causing sinus and eye irritation.

- -Cell #6: Toilet leaks and will not flush.
- -Cell #7: Non-functioning TV.

#### Medical Requests:

Cell#10: - Individuals requested transfer to Wayside and access to medical attention.

#11: Individuals reported to be in need of sleep-related medical support; requests work assignment. multiple individuals have made request for both medical and dental care and work requests.

### Recommendations:

### Sanitation & Maintenance

- -Deep cleaning of all common and cell surfaces, including glass in 1750B (#7, #8, #11).
- -Immediate repair of plumbing in 1750G #4, 1750B #17 and #23, and 2600B #3, #4, #6.
- -Consistent maintenance of lighting, toilets, and sinks across all units.
- -Address and clean biohazard stains in 1750B #16 and hall above #19.

### **Environmental Controls**

- -Inspect HVAC systems to resolve extreme heat (1750G #5) and cold temperatures (1750G Bustamente).
- -Investigate persistent smoke smells in 2600B.
- -Repair ventilation in 2600B and 1750G.

# Basic Necessities

- -Ensure regular delivery of toilet paper and timely, safe meals.
- Inspect for moldy food and conduct immediate kitchen safety review.
- -Ensure working TVs with captions and adequate channels.

### Medical & Legal Access

- -Immediate response to urgent medical cases, including:
- -Vomiting blood (1750B #19),
- -Sleep/mental health (2600B #11),
- -Ear/dental needs,

We told 6+ deputies and the watch commander (cc'd) about this, who shared that has been there for at least one week. Medical: - In #4, not getting suboxone for last few days (usually at MCJ but has court last few days) MCJ - In #4. did not receive antibiotics because was at court yesterday and today, MCJ - in #32, but usually at Supermax his head was bleeding and he said he needs heart medicine urgently (Lynsopil?) I have : needs vision impaired vest. he is falling on the stairs in mcj without accommodations in 5400 MCJ needs inhaler and has not been seen for his asthma. Did not disclose when originally booked. Does need to be seen Facility: - #20: We requested the group held inside be moved to another cell as this one was flooded from the ceiling, had feces on the floor, water dispenser and walls. Deputies moved the group, and told the inspectors we should not walk inside because it would be hazardous for us. Someone reported the deputies saying "Fuck 5000 floor." #35: Toilet not working #24: Water floods #25: one of the water dispensers was purposely clogged with toilet paper #5: Dirty, dirty cell/water fountain -- toilet paper not brought until inspectors requested from trustees -- told it was delayed multiple hours. There was a water #5: There was urine in a bottle. We were told the cell toilet was not working and people felt it was too dirty to use. needs pin number to call family -- has been in for a few weeks without being able to make calls without this number. Access to grievance and medical forms is nonexistent in front of dorm and is only provided once commissioners requested it from the deputy. People in these dorms cannot access the forms without getting them from staff or from the box in the hallway when/if they get out of their dorm.

People stated that they reported about a broken toilet (with it broken, there is only one toilet for 13 people. This causes many problems, including people reporting they have to urinate in the showers. They stated that after they complained, the deputies did not submit a work order and told them that if they continued to complain, they would be relocated out of the pod/unit. Since they didn't want to lose their housing, they didn't want the specific complaint reported. They want to have a functional toilet, but the watch commander made it seem like they would just be moved for a few hours. The inmates believe they will lose their housing completely.

Several delayed medical appointment for tumors and other serious medical issues noted to WC which had not been handled and lack of medical forms makes it impossible to file grievances. Highly concerning considering the module's population of those with medical needs.

## 78. Narrative Report

#### TOPLINE CONCERNS

Additional details on how and why the door from 912 to 913 is "bouncing" open creating unsafe situations for everyone involved, and on the day of the inspection resulting in an attack of one incarcerated individual by another.

There was collective and immense confusion from the currently incarcerated individuals in but 926 and 927 regarding why they were classified as "high power," in the "high power" area, and as such, receiving privilege reduction including but not limited to being handcuffed in hallways, caged for visits and more, and being segregated from others. Lt speer and Adams were under the impression this was supposed to be general population as assigned by Michael Markman through the new Operation Safe Jail program, however the deputy stationed at that pod reported it to be high power, the food had "HP" labeling, and the men reported limited privileged that correspond to a different classification.

Both Module 925 and 910 had a significant plumbing issue that caused safety and health concerns - when the cell next to you flushes, the content of the toilet goes into the next nearest toilet. This is especially concerning because one individual in 927 had Hep C.

#### GENERAL COMMENTS

NCCF outer building landscaping was being watered at the time of our arrival. It was apparent that the lawn sprinkler system had been running for an extended period since there was extensive water runoff on walkway to front door and driveway. Water conservation should be observed.

Inspection team decided to inspect module 925. Main access hallway to unit was littered with trash such as eggshells, food wrappers and juice cartons. The litter was minimal, however, out of place given the walkway was primarily used by facility staff.

Grievance and Correctional Health Request forms were available.

Various informational forms were posted including PREA notifications.

We saw 2 EBI courses taking place and all were very fully, one had 10+ in session and the had 20+ in attendance (i.e Health Sciences)

Deputy J. Stevens, employee #673795 had good rapport with the men in his module and was very cooperative with SBC commissioners

#### **DETAILED OBSERVATIONS – UNIT 928**

This unit was, for the most part, empty except for two cells where three individuals were being held.

Checked unoccupied cells and found #7 and #11 with no hot water.

#8 had extensive graffiti which was apparent in many cells in the unit.

Floors were swept and clutter free.

Phones appeared to be in working condition.

Two individuals in cell 12 were complaining of injuries. Individual # complained of a broken finger where it was caught smashed as a result of the closure of a "slider door" from one housing unit to another. This occurred a week ago. He stated that he was seen by medical staff and they stated the finger was broken, however, no follow-up has occurred.

Individual # in cell #9 stated he had broken nose which he received in an attack by another incarcerated individual and was waiting for x-rays.

These three individuals were being housed in this empty unit because another individual attacked them from another housing unit. These three individuals were

Were ALSO under the understanding that they were in a "high power" module but were unclear why they had received that classification as they had never received any written notification or write ups.

Talked to 5+ men they all had the same experience of getting transferred from MCJ on July 2 or 3rd, 2025, being visited by OIG inspector (Ms. Wright and TBD Arpine sp.) on Jul 7, 2025 (as indicated on an OIG card with handwritten notes I saw myself and will corroborate next month when the notes are published), and then multiple write ups show up for these men entered on July 8, 2025 which I saw for myself on the module computer. See please for specific examples:

had a write for having 2 knives and a tattoo machine which he claims to never have and to have never received a physical write up for note of narcotics entered on Jul 98 despite brewing places in 927 on 7/2/2025

- came to 927 7/3/2025 and also received a note on his record for "assault with a spear" on 7/8/2025

The incarcerated people uplifting this were concerned they were seeing retaliation after talking to the OIG inspector

The deputy shared that "high power" classifications usually happen because deputies observe others listening to them and not necessarily because they had been notified of this perceived activity.
