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"To advance the health of our patients and our communities by providing extraordinary care" On <u>January 24, 2017</u>, the Board of Supervisors (Board) instructed the then Director of the Health Agency, the Chief Executive Office, County Counsel, and the Department of Public Works to report back to the Board on the Health Agency's progress in implementing the Capital Improvements Intermediary (CII). Prior to September 17, 2018, the CII had been operated through the Flexible Housing Subsidy Pool (FHSP) work order between the Department of Health Services (DHS) and Brilliant Corners. On September 17, 2018, DHS executed a new work order with Brilliant Corners that is specifically for the CII Program (CIIP).

The intent of the CII and CIIP is to streamline Los Angeles County's (LA County's) ability to expand housing and supportive services for homeless individuals while allowing county agencies to cost effectively expedite efforts to support housing related capital improvement projects approved by LA County. Brilliant Corners manages the disbursement of CIIP funds for Small Scale Capital and Exploratory Grants (grants valued at no more than \$500,000) and Medium Scale Capital Grants (grants exceeding \$500,000). The approval of all CIIP projects require an amendment to the CIIP work order with Brilliant Corners and prior approval from DHS and County Counsel. For your reference, attached is the status report of currently approved CIIP Projects.

## Recommendation

DHS recommends that the Board sunset the quarterly CII public reports directed by the January 24, 2017. motion. Unless otherwise directed by the Board, DHS will work with the Executive Office of the Board to sunset the quarterly reports on the Board Agenda and merge the CII updates into the Housing for Health



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(HFH) biannual report. The next HFH biannual report will be issued in October 2022.
