# Progress on Developing Our Plans

## 1. Domains

- a. Behavioral Health (BH)
- b. Child Welfare & Family Well-Being (CWWF)
- c. Homelessness & Housing (HH)

## 2. Populations

- a. Families with Young Children, Ages 0-5
- b. Youth/Young Adults, Ages 11-26
- c. Systems-Impacted Transitional Aged Youth (TAY), Ages 18-26
- d. Older Adults, Ages 60+

## 3. Outcomes

- a. **CWWF:** Increase social, emotional and physical well-being of families with children ages 0-5, reduce number of children entering the child-welfare system, increase family stability
- b. **BH:** Increase social, emotional, mental well-being of youth/ young adults 11-26, reduce rates of youth disconnection, increase rates of connection to school and work
- c. **HH -TAY:** Decrease homelessness, increase housing stability, for County-systems impacted youth ages 18-26, reduce associated racial disparities
- d. **HH-OA:** Decrease homelessness, increase housing stability, for older adults ages 60+



# Next Steps to Develop Our Plans

## 4. Select Proposed Strategies (Board Report)

- a. Implement secondary prevention interventions to disrupt abuse cycles among young people who have been exposed to DV/IPV
- b. Maximize utilization of CalWORKs Home Visiting Program, and explore implementation of strategic funding models

## 5. Review Proposed Strategies (Board Report)

- a. Refine as needed, to better reflect equity, targeted outcomes, and specific vulnerable populations
- b. Align outcomes to address disparities and needs of at-risk communities
- c. Ensure County has authority/influence over strategies selected

## 6. Secure Inputs for Plan Development

- a. Stakeholder Engagement
- b. User Journey Mapping findings and recommendations
- c. Funding Stream Analysis and recommendations
- d. Policy, Regulatory Analysis and recommendations
- e. Data Sharing Policies/Universal Authorization
- f. Contracting Policies/Mechanism



# Next Steps to Implement Our Plans

## 7. Identify Implementation Resources (Funding, Staffing, etc. )

- a. Resource Allocation
  - i. Focus on available resources, given recent budget cuts and current fiscal environment
  - ii. Shift to actionable steps and targeted investments, not pilots
- b. New Resources Needed (coordinated, interdepartmental budgets)

## 8. Secure Policy Changes Needed/Establish Policy Agenda

## 9. Operational Management Plan

- a. Capacity to coordinate and manage roll-out of prevention Plans
- b. Where should prevention reside? (i.e., the PPCIT? TAY Housing - integrated into New Department?)
  - i. Monitor, adapt to, creation of New Department
  - ii. Work closely with New Department for alignment and shared goals

## 10. Program Delivery Plan

- a. Finalize Coordination Efforts
  - i. Clarify departmental leads, supporting bodies per Domain
  - ii. Focus on child welfare and family well-being, ensure alignment with current efforts
  - iii. Target primary prevention and promotion interventions



## Other Directives Pending Action

1. Communicate and Disseminate the Prevention and Promotion Model countywide
2. Incorporate the Prevention and Promotion Model within Departments
3. Work with Board Offices to determine where the PPCIT should ultimately reside
4. Formalize the County's "no-wrong-door" referral and service delivery framework
